SUBJECT: Brigade Policy Memorandum 7 – Alcohol Beverages at ROTC Social/Training Events

1. References.

2. Purpose. Outline Command policy regarding alcoholic beverages at JROTC/SROTC events to promote responsible consumption of alcohol.


3. Commanders will ensure that all ROTC social events abide by local law and university policy. In addition, commanders will ensure that measures are in place to prohibit minors from consuming any alcoholic beverage.

4. At any event where the PMS wants to include alcoholic beverages, he/she must do the following:

- a. Complete a Composite Risk Management Worksheet (submit to brigade at least 10 days prior to the event) and review plan with Brigade Commander or Brigade Deputy.
- b. Establish control measures for all social events to ensure responsible consumption of alcohol and no driving by Cadets who have consumed alcohol. Underage Cadets will not be “designated drivers”.
- c. Ensure no one under the age of 21 consumes alcohol.
- d. Ensure Cadre are role models for responsible consumption of alcohol.

5. The Brigade Commander is the approving authority for serving of alcohol at any ROTC event.
